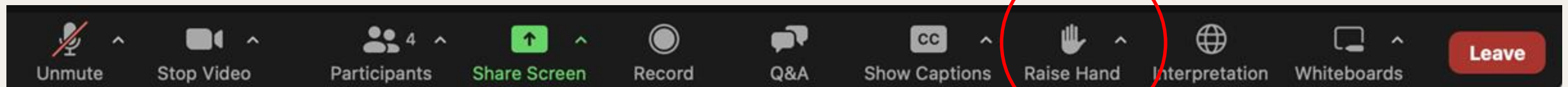

Working Session

Reminder: Task Force Objectives

- ✓ Develop recommendations on **how to equitably increase access to agricultural land for food production and traditional tribal agricultural uses** (Ting, Chapter 249, 2022).
- ✓ On or before **January 1, 2026**, the Task Force **shall submit a report** to the Legislature and Governor that includes a set of policy recommendations on how to address the agricultural land equity crisis.

Ideas and Topics from Prior Meetings:

1. Grant application and award processes:
 - a. More immediate access to funds after funds awarded to recipient
 - b. Misalignment between grant expectations and deliverables
 - c. Language barriers
2. Funding needs:
 - a. Public funding that directly supports land stewards
 - b. Funding for downpayments and taxes and maintenance
 - c. Mechanisms for timely response to acquisition opportunities and financial stability after acquisition
3. New pathways for land acquisition, including subsidies for land purchases, forgivable loans
4. *Others?*

Quick Overview: *Better Funding*

- Challenges with current system → application burden
- Report provides tables with “better,” “better yet,” and “better still” recommendations and examples for 3 areas:
 - Pre-application engagement
 - Applications
 - Post Award Processes
- Concludes with “the big idea:” Investible Climate Communities
 - Combine funds from one or more agencies to incrementally fund local and Tribal government energy and climate projects on a rolling basis

Examples: Program Eligibility

Better

- Idea 33: Include governments, NGO, CBO core staffing, administrative and indirect costs as allowable costs

Better Yet...

- Idea 42: Offer phased grants that can help communities ramp up from the concept stage and prepare technical details needed for scopes of work for implementation funding. Small concept design grants can be a good fit for “startup” programs without much resource to work with

Better Still...

- Idea 45: Develop a program specifically designed for local and tribal government energy and climate projects with flexible project activities
