Revisions to Bylaws

 Section II.F revised to reflect action on per diem allowances as per SB 1448

Section F: Compensation and Reimbursement of Expenses

- 1. <u>In compliance with Senate Bill 1448 section 75129.5 (a), public m</u>Members serve on a voluntary basis and shall not receive compensationshall receive a per diem allowance of \$500 per day for attendance at an agendized meeting of the California Agricultural Land Equity Task Force, as approved by members on November 13, 2024.
- 2. Separately, all members of the Task Force shall be allowed necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duty. This includes reimbursement Members may be reimbursed for authorized travel and per diem expenses for attendance at Task Force and subcommittee meetings in accordance with the California Department of Human Resources and California State Administrative Manual Travel Reimbursement Requirements.
- 3. Pursuant to Gov. Code 11009, except as otherwise expressly provided by law, the members of State boards and commissions, including this Task Force, shall serve without compensation, but shall be allowed necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duty.

 - Dropped "Land Access and Acquisition" and "Land Tenure" as organizational categories
 - Created placeholder sections for priority recommendations and case studies
 - Created a separate document for "ideas to track"
- Conceptual
 - Defined and adopted "priority producers and land stewards"
 - Clarified ideas in "What can agricultural land equity achieve?" section
- Language
 - Revised for consistency and clarity
 - Line-item changes as requested

Discussion: Next Steps for Advancing Ideas

What must we discuss today before moving forward to subcommittees and the Advisory Committee?

1. Return ancestral lands & advance sovereignty for CA Tribal Nations

- Return State-owned lands to Tribal Nations
- 2. Fund, incentivize, and support ancestral land return projects
- 3. Remove barriers to sovereignty

2. Conserve & protect CA's agricultural land

- Incorporate agricultural land equity into existing conservation priorities
- 2. Support land trusts focused on equity
- Establish financial, technical, & legal support for land trusts and technical assistance providers to better serve priority producers and land stewards
- 4. Improve conservation tools for land stewards

3. Facilitate equitable transition of private lands

- Facilitate transparent and fair land sales
- Develop a state-level succession strategy
 - 1. Tax credits and revisions to tax law
 - 2. Funding for land-linking programs
 - 3. Producer pension fund

6. Increase fair access to public funding for land acquisition

- Expand and improve technical assistance and capacity-building programs to meet the needs of priority producers and land stewards
- 2. Revise existing programs to advance agricultural land equity
- 3. Fund land acquisition for priority producers and land stewards

7. Support and incentivize changes in zoning and land use planning

- Develop model ordinances and direct, support, and incentivize local governments to follow guidance in report
- Remove barriers to building infill housing to reduce development pressure

Strategies

- Establish and fund a department in the California State Lands Commission to conduct research and provide technical assistance
- Establish and fund a Land Observatory to monitor ag land markets and manage public database
- 3. Establish and fund a Tribal State Lands Committee to identify surplus lands and to establish pathways for land return
- 4. Establish and fund a publicly held land bank


